



A Smallholders Life and Times

"Rain rain go away, come again another day"; we used to chant this in the playground at Titley school Not much has changed; each year we have a different weather challenge. As a smallholder, gardener and horse rider now facing life and its challenges on my own since my partner Merv Tong died last year, I do try and be positive about most things.

The seed order arrived, and the broad beans and sweet peas had been sown into pots and placed in my new polytunnel. Lovely green shoots appeared, only to be snapped off by a mouse who had taken all the seeds from below leaving only the green shoots as evidence. There is still time. I had to sow some more, but this time I put them in a safe place hopefully away from voracious pests!

Riding a horse around the surrounding lanes is always interesting, being able to look over the hedges, listening to birdsong and generally enjoying nature. Sometimes the peace is disrupted by the occasional runner busily texting, with earbuds firmly fixed who runs into the back of my horse. Or the motorist who is unable to stop on a narrow lane, just for ten seconds so I can ride safely past, who then shouts, "horses shouldn't be on the roads". People forget horses were our main form of transport for hundreds of years.

Horse riding is now a wonderful form of therapy in our busy lives, and another way of observing things. In a field not far away from where I live, I have noticed at least five footballs kicked over the hedge from a nearby property. Goodness knows what will happen when the combine comes along at harvest time.

I have hung up my lambing waterproofs after nearly 20 years of delivering lambs. With Merv gone, it would have been impossible to continue, but I have chosen five sheep as field ornaments. I do

miss the lambs leaping about, but not the endless bottle feeding, late nights and the traumas that go with lambing time, not to mention the vet bills.

Holly our one remaining goat, is allowed to roam freely but not in the vegetable garden! Goats do not eat washing off the line, but I've discovered that they do eat daffodils, roses and will nibble at your hair given the opportunity. Holly loves to be near the horses, rubbing herself against them and I think that she would be an excellent burglar deterrent, creeping up behind them to chew their hair!

I often notice a single red kite flying in our area and wonder if it is Merv in spirit keeping an eye on me.
